The "Media Training Workshop in Preparation for the COP20" responds to the need to build capacity of the media in developing countries, so that they can inform the public about the status of the UN climate change negotiations, designed to achieve a strong and effective universal climate change agreement in 2015, and to raise awareness on the main climate change challenges and possible solutions

The objective of the workshop is to provide up-to-date information about climate change in the region, as well as about the different negotiating forums surrounding the COP20/CMP10, to a group of journalists from Latin America and the Caribbean.

The training will provide tools to the media professionals to raise awareness on how a universal climate change agreement can contribute to greening the economic growth of developing countries and improving their ability to cope with the impacts of climate change.
